

Provost's Report to VCU Faculty Senate -- September 5, 2023

Highlights

I'm pleased to share with you the progress that is occurring across VCU.

Rebounding Student Enrollment

Simply stated: This year's class of entering first-year students may just be the biggest in university history.

- We are currently serving 4,612 **first-year students** including those you may have read about living in the Graduate Hotel, just off campus. VCU's former record is 4,600.
- Overall undergraduate enrollment is trending 1.4% higher than fall 2022.
- I am excited about the students I will be meeting this year through the **Provost student advisory** group.

This is a good first step but VCU has a ways to go before we have turned the corner. We have to continue on this path.

Repositioning Task Force Proceeds to Phase Two

The <u>One VCU Academic Repositioning Task Force</u>, which consists of faculty and staff members and deans, organized into eight working groups, recently presented their reports signaling the end of the first phase of their work.

They are considering the number of, and the structure of, VCU's academic units in order to offer recommendations designed to:

- Create a pipeline for new, engaging, and exciting degree programs in emerging fields;
- Maximize operational efficiencies and collaboration between programs;
- Facilitate more cross-unit engagement and transdisciplinary research opportunities for faculty; and
- Create new career pathways for preparing students to succeed in a rapidly-changing world.

By tapping into the collective intellect of our faculty and staff, this task force is both the height of shared governance and the launch pad for bold academic innovation.

VCU's Growing Research Profile

VCU's rapidly-growing research enterprise has reached historical heights and is gaining national and global recognition.

- We announced last year that VCU received more than \$400 million in sponsored funding, a 49% increase in just five years and the highest figure in the university's history we expect to announce even bigger numbers soon.
- That growth is being felt broadly across our campuses. In fact, research funding increased last year across every single VCU academic unit.
- In a related note, the **VCU daVinci Center Shift Retail Lab** just earned Fast Company's 2023's Innovation By Design Award for Learning. Winners in other categories include Capital One, Yeti, IBM, and Microsoft putting VCU among impressive company.

Faculty Excellence

Work will soon begin on a faculty-led taskforce to update **VCU's Promotion & Tenure Policy**, which is currently at least a decade old.

- Our faculty deserve a modern evaluation process that fairly, equitably, and transparently accounts
 for a wide variety of activities across research, scholarship, pedagogy, service, and other duties and
 responsibilities faculty members perform. And we should have confidence in the consistent level of
 excellence that process is demanding across all academic units.
- The task force will consider policies for both tenured and tenure-eligible faculty members and term faculty members.
- Final recommendations are expected by the end of this coming January.

Celebrating VCU Faculty

- James Ferri, Ph.D, associate chair of the Department of Chemical and Life Sciences Engineering in the College of Engineering, has been named chair-elect of the National Institute for Pharmaceutical Technology & Education (NIPTE) faculty. NIPTE brings together academic professionals and researchers, industry leaders and other stakeholders to improve how medicines are designed, developed and manufactured to meet patients' needs in the 21st century. VCU Engineering became a member of NIPTE in 2021.
- Suzanne Ruder, Ph.D., associate chair and professor in the Department of Chemistry in the College of Humanities and Sciences, has been named as a recipient of the 2023 James Flack Norris Award for Outstanding Achievement in the Teaching of Chemistry by the Northeastern Section of the American Chemical Society. Ruder, along with Renée Cole, Ph.D., a chemistry professor at the University of Iowa, and Juliette Lantz, a chemistry professor at Drew University, will receive the award for their work together on the National-Science Foundation-funded Enhancing Learning by Improving Process Skills in STEM (ELIPSS) Project, which focuses on the identification, development, and assessment of process skills also known as professional skills, practical skills, workplace skills, transferable skills, or soft skills in undergraduate STEM classrooms.

- Milos Manic, Ph.D., professor of computer science in the College of Engineering, has been
 elected by the National Academy of Inventors to the rank of senior member. The honor recognizes
 faculty, scientists and administrators who have produced technologies that have brought, or aspire
 to bring, real impact on the welfare of society. Manic, who is director of VCU's Cybersecurity Center,
 was one of only three inventors from Virginia included in the academy's 2023 class of senior
 members.
- Five Virginia Commonwealth University junior faculty members were recently selected as Blick Scholars. This prestigious recognition, which is made possible through The George and Lavinia Blick Research Fund, funds innovative medical research. The Blick Scholars are: Yana Cen, Ph.D., assistant professor, Department of Medicinal Chemistry, School of Pharmacy; Peter Hamilton, Ph.D., assistant professor, Department of Anatomy and Neurobiology, School of Medicine; Anika L. Hines, Ph.D., MPH, assistant professor, Department of Health Behavior and Policy, School of Medicine; Audrey Lafrenaye, Ph.D., assistant professor, Department of Anatomy and Neurobiology, School of Medicine; and Rebecca Martin, Ph.D., assistant professor, Department of Microbiology and Immunology, School of Medicine.
- The <u>VCU Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences Fund</u>, an internal grant opportunity created in 2022 to support, facilitate and enhance the creation, production and dissemination of arts, humanities and social sciences research, has awarded its second class of grants to 10 faculty members and their projects:
